THE NATIONAL PARKS ORDINANCE  
THE LAMBIR HILL NATIONAL PARK PROCLAMATION  
(Made under section 7(2))

1. This proclamation may be cited as the Lambir Hill National Park Proclamation, 1975.
2. The land described in the Schedule II shall, with effect from 15th May, 1975 be constituted as a National Park, to be known as the Lambir Hill National Park.
3. The privileges conceded within the National Park shall, subject to the provision of Section 14 of the National Parks Ordinance, be listed in Schedule I.

Name: Lambir Hills National Park  
Division: Fourth  
District: Miri  
Area: 17,172 acres approximately

Boundaries: Commencing at survey mark T120 the boundary follows a cut line bearing  $150^{\circ}23'$  for 2,908 links to Pantu Buri N101 thence bearing  $190^{\circ}00'$  for approximately 2,000 links to a logging road, thence the logging road in a westerly direction for approximately 35,200 links to a point on the right hand side of the Miri/Bintulu Road; thence following the Miri/Bintulu Road in a south westerly direction for approximately 40,000 links where it crosses the Sg. Lian Libau; thence it follows the existing boundary of the Lambir Forest Reserve for a distance of approximately 31,000 links to the confluence of Sg. Luak and Sg. Pagang; thence by cut line in a north westerly direction for approximately 16,000 links to a point on the true left bank of Sg. Kejapel; thence upstream along the true left bank of Sg. Kejapel following the existing boundary of Lambir Forest Reserve for approximately 12,800 links to survey mark No. 1; thence joining successively survey mark Nos. 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37 and 38 at a point on the true left bank of Sg. Jakang; thence upstream along the true left bank of Sg. Jakang for a distance approximately 16,000 links to a point north of survey mark No. 22. Thence due south to survey mark No. 22, thence joining successively survey marks Nos. 22, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 4/4957, 230, 231, 232, 233, 4/5952, 248, 249, 250, 251, 4/5954, 4/6053, 4/6054, 255, 256, 257, 258, 259, 260, 261, 262, 263, 4/5908, 4/5907, 4/5906, 267, 268, 269, 4/5905, 4/5343, 4/5348, 273, 274, 275, 276, 4/5571, 4/5795, 4/5902, 280, 281, 282, 283, 678 thence by cut lines bearing  $68^{\circ}15'$  for 26,100 links and  $160^{\circ}15'$  for 14,500 links to the survey mark T120, the point of commencement.
