THE WILD LIFE PROTECTION ORDINANCE

THE SAMUNSAM WILD LIFE SANCTUARY ORDER, 1979

(Made under section 9)

WHEREAS on the 2nd day of February, 1978, the Yang di-Pertua Negeri in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 of the Wild Life Protection Ordinance (Cap. 128) issued a Commission under the Commissions of Inquiry Ordinance (Cap. 6) to inquire into the proposal that part of the Gunung Pueh Forest Reserve be constituted a Wild Life Sanctuary for the purpose of protecting all animals, and in particular proboscis monkeys, living in that area:

AND WHEREAS after consideration of the report of the Commissioners, the Yang di-Pertua Negeri in Council has pursuant to the provisions of section 9 of the Wild Life Protection Ordinance (Cap. 128) made the following Order—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as the **Samunsam Wild Life Sanctuary Order, 1979.**

2. It is hereby directed that, with effect from 1st July, 1978, the area of land described in the First Schedule shall be constituted a Wild Life Sanctuary to be known as the Samunsam Wild Life Sanctuary.

Rights and  
privileges.

3. Subject to and in accordance with any directions which may be issued by the Director of Forests, it is hereby established that the native community of Telok Melano, Telok Serabang, Kampung Pueh and Kampung Bedaun shall have the right to collect nipah palm, in addition to the privilege of taking forest produce for their own consumption, from a strip not deeper than 2,000 links along that part of the coastal boundaries of the Samunsam Wild Life Sanctuary described in the Second Schedule.

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for 120 metres; thence follows a series of cut lines bearing  $92^{\circ} 00'$  for 500 metres;  $45^{\circ} 00'$  for 1500 metres;  $345^{\circ} 00'$  for 750 metres;  $33^{\circ} 00'$  for 500 metres;  $87^{\circ} 00'$  for 350 metres to the coast at Tanjung Enigi; thence follows the coast line towards southerly direction for 2500 metres to a point ( $1^{\circ} 57' 32''N/109^{\circ} 30' 49''E$ ); thence into the South China sea in a Easterly direction with bearing  $90^{\circ} 00'$  for 2300 metres (1.2 Nautical Mile);  $11^{\circ} 51' 32''N/109^{\circ} 40' 07''E$ ;  $180^{\circ} 00'$  for 2000 metres (1.08 Nautical Mile);  $270^{\circ} 00'$  for 2100 metres (1.13 Nautical Mile) to a point at the coast ( $1^{\circ} 56' 10''N/109^{\circ} 39' 06''E$ ); thence follows the coastal line towards southerly direction for 4000 metres; thence follows a series of cut lines bearing  $270^{\circ} 00'$  for 600 metres;  $15^{\circ} 00'$  for 300 metres;  $211^{\circ} 00'$  for 260 metres;  $339^{\circ} 00'$  for 364 metres;  $25^{\circ} 00'$  for 570 metres;  $338^{\circ} 00'$  for 1200 metres to meet a point on the true right bank of Sungai Samun-am; thence crosses Sungai Samun-am; thence follows the true left bank of Sungai Samun-am upstream for 1200 metres to come back to the point of commencement.

*Note.* Bearing and distance are approximate only and the demarcated boundaries and grid reference points shall be considered correct.
